Advice for driving on expressway

Departure

Everyone should wear a seatbelt. And don't forget the people sitting in back.

The fatality rate of people not wearing seat belts is 9.2 times higher than those wearing seatbelts on expressways. A seatbelt is a life net protecting you and your family. Everyone, whether sitting in the driver's seat, next to the driver or in the back seats, should always wear a seatbelt.




What is ETC?

ETC (Electronic Toll Collection System) is a system that allows drivers to pay tolls without stopping their cars. To use this ETC system, inserting an ETC card into the onboard ETC unit installed in the car. When you drive through an ETC gate, wireless communication takes place between the unit and an antenna installed at the gate.

- Drivers must enter the lane marked as " ETC専用 (ETC Only)" or "ETC/一般 (ETC/Cash)" when using the ETC. "ETC専用 (ETC Only)" or "ETC/一般 (ETC/Cash)" is indicated at the top of the
- If you fail to insert an ETC card, then "STOP" sign appears and the gate does not open.
- If you see a red light at an ETC entrance gate, use a staffed gate to receive a ticket. And when you exit, use a staffed gate again and hand your ETC card over to the toll collector with the ticket given at the entrance.
- If you see a red light at the ETC exit gate, use a staffed gate and hand your ETC card over to the toll collector.

Check which lanes allow ETC!



Precautions for driving with ETC

• Is your ETC card inserted properly?

If your ETC card is not properly inserted into the onboard unit, the gate will not open. Ensure that it is properly in place before going through an ETC gate.

• Do not exceed 20 km/h when entering the lane!

You may need to stop suddenly in cases such as an abrupt stop by the vehicle in front or if the toll gate bar does not open due to entering the wrong lane or improperly inserting your ETC card in an ETC lane.

• Maintain a safe distance between vehicles!

The vehicle ahead of you in an ETC lane may stop suddenly.

• Do not put your car in reverse!

There is a danger that the vehicle behind you may fail to stop, or you may hit a toll booth personnel member. Even in an ETC lane, do not attempt to put your car in reverse to leave the lane. Wait for a staff member in your car.

Do not drive through the gate when the signal is red!

2 Entering tollgates



Slow down to 20 km/h or slower

1 Check your lane.





ETC専用 ETC lanes are for ETC cars, and 一般 drivers using cash or credit cards should use the general lanes. There are blue and yellow (or white) road signs in front of the ETC lanes. ETC/一般 There are also mixed lanes that can be used by both ETC cars and general cars. Check the lane type before entering.

2 Pass through the tollgate.

Stop and take a ticket from the ticket machine. Pay the toll at the exit.



Other ways of passing through tollgates for cash/credit cards users

Sapporo-Nishi IC to Sapporo-Minami IC Flat **Rate Section**

Pay the toll at the entrance gate.

Otaru IC to Sapporo-Nishi IC

Sapporo-Nishi IC and Otaru IC are free to enter. (There are no tollgates.) Receive an entrance ticket at the Asari, Zenibako, and Teine tollgates, and pay when you exit with the ticket. Note that when you enter the Asari tollgate, you will be asked in which direction you are going to (towards Otaru or Sapporo) at the gate. Towards Otaru, pay the toll there. Towards Sapporo, receive a ticket and pay when you exit with the ticket.


3 Never drive in the wrong direction

There have been cases of drivers entering the expressway, get confused about their direction, find themselves driving in the opposite direction they wanted to, and then turning around and driving. If you find yourself driving in the opposite direction you want to, do not turn around. Instead, get off at the next interchange, and tell the toll collector.

Attention

At Ikeda IC (Doto Expressway), gates are separated by direction.

Merging with the main lane

Decide what you want to do without hesitating, speed up sufficiently and join the flow of traffic!

1 Check the traffic flow on the main lane





It's a lane for accelerating to the speed of the cars on the main lane when merging to



When you have entered the acceleration lane, watch the flow of traffic in the main lane, make sure there is a sufficient distance between your car and the car in front of you, then give a turn signal.

the main lane from an interchange, etc.





2 Determine which car you will follow, then accelerate sufficiently.

An acceleration lane runs parallel to the main lane, and from it you agilely decide the position where you will enter the flow of traffic using your direct sight and mirrors. Drivers should decide which car they want to get behind, rather than which car they want to get in front of, and accelerate sufficiently. Sudden acceleration can lead to skidding and accidents, so please be careful.

3 Check the positions of the cars driving on the main lane and gently join the flow of traffic.



When joining the flow of traffic, check your right rear direction using mirrors and your direct sight (there are blind spots when using mirrors) and gently enter following your target car while adjusting your speed to match it.





Advice

If you fail to join the flow of traffic and stop

In case you stop at the end of acceleration lane. Missing a chance to merge, do not panic. Turn on your turn signal and wait for the right moment to enter the main lane.



Driving on the expressway Important point



Drive at a safe speed and keep your eyes

1 Keep your eyes on the road!



Hokkaido has beautiful scenery, and it is easy to take your eyes off the road without knowing. At a speed of 100 km per hour, a car advances 28 meters per second. Taking your eyes off the road causes rear-end collisions

Maintain a safe distance from the vehicle in front of you!

If you keep an enough distance, a driver's field of visions grows and it becomes possible to avoid such dangers as rear-end collisions. To get information about what is in front of you as soon as possible, try to put enough distance between your car and others while

2 Drive at a safe speed.





The law states that on expressways, the left lane is the driving lane and the right lane is the passing lane. Return to the driving lane after passing. Also, remember that speeding can cause accidents. Pay attention to speed limit signs and drive at a safe speed suitable for road conditions

4 Watch out for animals!

Accidents caused by animals such as deer and foxes are not unusual. Drive at a safe speed while paying close attention to what is in front of you. Particularly at night, it takes time to notice animals, so be careful. If you see an animal on the expressway, report it using an emergency telephone or the Road Emergency Hotline (#9910).



Drive at a safer speed and keep plenty of distance between vehicles.

weather changes



In the winter, even when the sky is clear a snowstorm can suddenly appear. Be alert to changes in the weather.

1 Watch out for sudden **2** Turn on your headlights in a snowstorm or blizzard



At times, visibility can be suddenly reduced by a snowstorm or blizzard. Keep your headlights on at all times to make your car stand out.



Maintain more distance between cars than in summer

On snowy winter roads, a driver needs three times more stopping distance than in the summer.

4 "Sudden" is taboo

Sudden braking and sudden steering cause slipping and can lead to serious accidents. "Sudden" is an absolute taboo.

5 Tunnels



Offensive lane changes and passing cause accidents.

1 Watch out for the black hole effect and sensibility changes.

Because of the contrast with the brightness outside a tunnel, the car in front of you can seem to be absorbed by shadows when it enters a tunnel and become hard to see. Also, inside a tunnel it can suddenly become difficult to judge whether a car in front of you is moving or stopping. Do not try to change lanes or pass offensively, and maintain a safe driving speed.





2 Turn on your headlights in a tunnel.

Simply turning on your headlights inside a tunnel helps cars behind you avoid rear-end collisions. Also, keeping sufficient distance between cars helps prevent accidents.



Service areas (SA) and Parking areas (PA)



Whenever you feel tired or sleepy, take a rest.

Service areas and parking areas are facilities for resting along an expressway. All service areas and parking areas have restrooms.

Some also have restaurants, shops and gas stations.

Check the "Guide to Service Symbols" on pages 3 and 4.

1 If you feel sleepy, don't push it. Take a rest.



Driving for an long period of time tends to be monotonous and to lose concentration. When you get tired or sleepy, be sure not to push it and take a rest at a service area or parking area to refresh yourself.



2 Park properly in a parking space

When a standard car parks in a parking space for a large vehicle or a large vehicle in a space for a standard car, it can cause trouble for users who arrive later. Be sure to park in a parking space that matches the size of your car. (A security guard may guide you to a space.) Also, drive slowly in a service area or parking area. Pedestrians should watch for cars while walking.



3 Never drive in the wrong direction




Drivers sometimes get confused about direction or drive the wrong way after resting. Carefully check signs and direction boards before setting out.

Getting there



Usage precautions

- The smart interchange accepts ETC cars only. (Cars without an onboard ETC unit cannot enter, even if you have an ETC card.)
- Because data transmission happens when a car is stopped, if a car does not come to a complete stop, the gate will not open.
- Be sure to make a complete stop in front of the bar.
- The interchange cannot be used from ordinary roads for the parking area only (or for U-turns).
- Drive slowly because there are pedestrians in the parking area.
- Following another car is not allowed.(Only one car can pass through each time the bar is raised.)

From the expressway to exit tollgates



Check your exit with exit signs

1 Check your exit interchange





Exits are announced 2 km, 1km, and 500m in advance, by sign. Check the signs and prepare to exit driving in the left driving lane.



2 Pass through the tollgate.

Paying by ETC

Slow down to 20 km per hour or slower and enter the lane, then pass through slowly.



Paying by cash or credit card

Hand over your pass at the exit to gate. Pay your toll by cash or credit card.



Other ways of passing through tollgates

Sapporo-Nishi IC to Sapporo-Minami IC Flat Rate Section

You are free to exit. (There are no tollgates.) Where traffic merges with public roads, cars must come to a full stop (except for in Sapporo-Minami IC). Also, you cannot exit from the Flat Rate Section onto public roads in Sapporo-Nishi IC and the Sapporo IC.

If you entered at Otaru IC or Sapporo-Nishi IC

Hand over your entrance ticket at the exit tollgate. Note that if you entered at Otaru IC or the Sapporo-Nishi IC (Free Interchange), you don't get an entrance ticket, the toll collector will ask you which interchange you entered. Please tell him which interchange you used. Pay by cash or credit card, depending on the entrance interchange.

Driving manners and in case of emergency

Do not cut off other vehicles

Cars that are cut off can cause accidents by steering abruptly or putting on their emergency brakes.

2 Use cell phones and navigation systems only at service areas and parking areas.

It is illegal to use a cell phone while driving. Using a cell phone can cause you to focus on operating it and to lose attention to the road in front of you, leading to accidents. It is also illegal to park on the shoulder of the road and use a cell phone or operate a navigation system. Use service areas and parking areas.

3 When changing lanes, always use your turn signal.

Changing lanes without thinking causes accidents, and when you change lanes, use your rearview mirror and direct sight to check safety, then turn on your turn signal before changing lanes. After you have finished changing lanes, quickly turn off your turn signal.

4 If an accident occurs

Turn on your hazard flashers to signal cars approaching from behind you. After you stop your car, light an emergency flare canisters and triangular stop signs. Accidents involving stopped cars are increasing, so both drivers and passengers should pay attention to cars that are passing by while getting out and take refuge in a safe place such as outside the guardrail.

When using a rental car

- ① When there is a change in your usage period or times, let your rental car company know in advance.

Use expressways safely and comfortably in the winter

Be extra careful in these kinds of places!

-In order to drive safely and comfortably on expressways in the winter-



Twice as many accidents happen in the winter as in the spring and fall in Hokkaido

In a typical year, accidents suddenly increase around November, the beginning of winter. In winter, road surfaces become extremely slippery because they are covered with snow and ice, so driving at the same speeds and same steering as in summer is quite dangerous.

Always drive with great care and with possible dangers in mind.

Next to a large vehicle



When you are driving behind or next to a large vehicle, a cloud of snow can decrease your visibility, so be careful.

Before curves



Driving too fast may cause an accident. Reduce your speed before curves and avoid abrupt steering and sudden stops.

On bridges



Winter winds cause a lot of black ice. Be careful not to skid.

Long downhill stretches



Driving downhill for long distances may cause your speed to increase. Take care to maintain an appropriate speed and a safe distance from the vehicle ahead of you.

Entrances and exits of tunnels



High winds and sudden snow may occur. Take care when driving through tunnels as the road inside may become icy.

Road conditions in the shade



Pay close attention to road conditions in the shade on mountain roads and under bridges. Ice develops easily in these areas due to the low temperature.

Measures for snow and ice

Roads are being cleared of snow 24 hours a day to allow drivers to use them more safely and comfortably. Depending on road conditions, this work may be going on even after the weather has improved.

You may not pass snowplows in operation.

Safety is the first priority, so passing is not allowed.

Snow cleared aside by snowplows causes differences in level, so for safety's sake passing is not allowed.



Snowplows regularly suspend operations at some intervals to allow cars to pass.

Snowplows in operation may not be passed, but snowplows suspend operations at some intervals, and pull over to the hard shoulder to allow cars behind them to pass.

Snow removal work

Clearing newly fallen snow



A group of three snowplows and a VMS vehicle is working together to clear entire lanes. So long as this work is going on, passing is not possible.

Snow removal for widening



Snow pushed onto the shoulders of roads is cast off the road by rotary-type snowplows.

On bridges and elevated sections of road it is loaded into dump trucks and carried away.

Work to prevent freezing



To prevent road surfaces from freezing, an anti-freezing agent (sodium chloride) is scattered. Take care in passing while the agent is being sprayed. Take care in passing while the agent is being scattered.

Shiroi Koibito Park

At Shiroi Koibito Park, in addition to observing the production line of Shiroi Koibito cookies, tasting original sweets and more, visitors can also have fun making sweets. At the Cookiecraft Studio, they have aprons and hats ready so you can participate easily. Among the options is the "My Shiroi Koibito" experience in which you use a chocolate pen to draw pictures and write messages on a 14 cm, heart-shaped Shiroi Koibito cookie. Come into contact with animals up close

North Safari Sapporo

This is a facility where you can come into contact with animals you normally cannot get close to, such as capybaras, seals and penguins, and even feed lions and bears. The chance to put an enormous python around your neck is also popular. A bird show featuring owls and hawks is put on every day. There are plenty of activities on offer including snowmobiles and dogsleds in the winter, and a jungle tour on amphibious vehicles and four-wheel buggies in the summer.

This is one of the largest managed fishing areas in Japan, where visitors can enjoy fishing without bringing any equipment with them. Visitors can partake in lure and fly fishing from spring to autumn and catch rainbow trout, whitespotted char, Japanese huchen and Dolly Varden trout. And during the winter visitors may experience snowmobiling between the groves surrounding the lake. Anyone can drive a snowmobile after about five minutes of simple instruction. Visitors may ride around the snowfields for up to three hours.

Aguarium of north earth

This is an aguarium of fish gathered from the rivers and lakes found amid the mountains of Hokkaido, fish that are rare within Japan. In the "Four Seasons Tank," where a Hokkaido river has been re-created, visitors can see the behavior of various kinds of river fish. The fish include the landlocked masu salmon, Salvelinus leucomaenis and Salvelinus malma miyabei. The "Waterfall Basin Tank," which allows you to experience the sensation of being in the basin of a waterfall, is another highlight. The aquarium has many appealing exhibits, including a large tank in which swim 40 Hucho perryi, which is known as a huge, fancy fish.



Walking in the Forest and on the Surface of Lake Akan

A spring-only pleasure

Pink Bibai Tunnel

From Mikasa IC to Bibai IC



The Bibai Tunnel entrance (in the direction from Sapporo to Asahikawa) has been planted with moss phlox in places. When you drive toward Asahikawa in the spring, you can enjoy the pink tunnel.

Crab tunnel

From Noboribetsu Muroran IC to Motowanishi Observatory

When you drive toward Hakodate, you will see a cute crab on the Kamishiro tunnel entrance.

At the time discussions were underway on how this tunnel 4 kilometers before the cities past the Muroran IC could be used for tourism PR for Muroran, Oshamanbe and Hakodate. Many candidates were considered. including Hakucho Bridge, Mount Usu and Cape Chikyu, but because the expressway runs along Uchiura Bay, it was decided to create a monument using the image of a crab in relief. The crab is a famous marine product of Uchiura Bay. Thus appeared this huge crab 9.5 meters tall and 14 meters wide.

Between Otoshibe IC and Mori IC

The animals whose bodies are most frequently recovered on Hokkaido expressways are birds. river fish while flying at low altitudes.

Birds of prey have a behavior of catching Placing 4 meter poles at 2 meter intervals on both sides of bridges over the rivers that are their feeding grounds causes them to fly so as to avoid the poles and prevents collisions with cars.

The Washinoki Ruins above the tunnel

Between Otoshibe IC and Mori IC

The Washinoki Ruins are a stone circle and pit cemetery from first half of the latter part of the Jomon Period (some 4000 years ago) discovered when the expressway was being built in 2002.

The stone circle is made up of approximately 600 stones of 20 cm to 60 cm in diameter, and the elliptical shape of 37 meters by 34 meters is one of the largest in Hokkaido. It is thought to have been a holy place for religious ceremonies and rituals.

In 2005, due to the tunnel construction method, it was decided to preserve the ruins in their present condition. Carefully carrying out the construction, the crew succeeded in preserving it with sinkage of iust 1 cm.

The town of Mori is responsible for managing the ruins. Because the ruins are being preserved using a waterproof canvas, they are not currently open to the public.

In 2006, The Washinoki Ruins became a nationally designated historic site, and in 2009, they were added to the UNESCO World Heritage provisional list as part of "the Jomon Archaeological Sites in Hokkaido, Northern Tohoku, and other regions."

The Hidaka Mountains and the Tokachi Plain

Between Tokachi-Shimizu IC and Tokachiheigen SA



When you head west from the Memuro IC toward Sapporo and pass the Tokachiheigen Service Area, the Doto Expressway runs across the Tokachi Plain. The land on each side of the expressway is covered with fields of wheat, beats, beans and other crops. At harvest time each has its own color and the land appears clothed in patchwork. After a while you will see right in front of you the Hidaka Mountains, which are known as the backbone of Hokkaido. That sight seen from the expressway is a highlight and it will truly make you feel you have driven across Hokkaido. The Doto Expressway makes you hold the island of Hokkaido in awe and allows you to fully experience scenery of a different kind from Honshu's.

LED snow poles

"LED snow poles" are equipment designed for safe driving on the expressways of Hokkaido in winter. They are installed every 50 meters as eyemarks for drivers (visual guidance) for times of poor visibility due to thick fog, snowstorms and blizzards.
